

FIRST HALF, 2017 FINANCIAL SUMMARY

First Half, 2017 Pledge Offering totaled \$260,709, lower than Budget by \$11,764 or 4% but higher than last year by \$5,595 or 2%. These represent 70.2% of total First Half Receipts. Thanks to our church members for their pledge offerings in the first half of the year. Now that we are in the second half of the year, we continue to encourage our church members to remain current with their Pledges. This will allow our church to achieve its missionary and outreach goals and meet our financial obligations on a timely basis.

Combined Receipts in the First Half of 2017 totaled \$371,508, higher than Budget by \$17,376 or 4.9% with positive variances in General and Miscellaneous Receipts, Trust Income and Local and Foreign Outreach Funding more than offsetting lower Pledge and Unpledged Receipts and Investment Income.

Total expenses for the First Half, 2017 was \$354,712, slightly lower than Budgeted Expenses of \$356,945.

Net Surplus for the First Half, 2017 totaled \$16,796, compared to a Budgeted deficiency of \$2,813. This is very positive and illustrates that our Church is operating within its Budgetary Guidelines.

In summary, higher than Budgeted Receipts and lower than Budgeted expenses were the reasons for your Church's First Half Positive Net Surplus.

The Projects funded by the \$40,000 Grant from The Cannon Charitable Trust.

1 – Complete the final phase of replacing HVAC units, with high energy efficient systems (Welcome Center).

2 – Replace the exterior door leading to the playground from the educational wing with an energy efficient door & a panic bar exit.

- **3** Replace all exterior wood doors in the Nave & add panic bars.
- 4 Install lever lock door handles in the education wing and office area to improve safe-
- ty and ease of access in compliance with the American Disability Act.

5 - Replacing halogen lamps in the parking lot with LED lamps.

The Tour de Saints' charity bike ride, scheduled for Saturday August 26th, is an annual outreach event hosted by All Saints Episcopal Church. This event is in support of Cooperative Christian Ministries of Cabarrus County.

The ride will begin and end at All Saints Episcopal Church on Lake Concord Road. The Concord Police Department helps get our cyclists safely out of town and on to less traveled country roads, and The Cabarrus Sheriff's Department takes it from there.



Routes are available for all ability levels. The 50k, 100k and 50-mile routes traverse scenic rural areas of Cabarrus and Rowan County on classic "Back Country Roads." A 12-mile Family Route is also scheduled. Riders participating in the event will pay an entry fee and donate non-perishable food items. We will provide lunch to the

participants and sell lunch to guests.

SURVEY ABOUT SOCIAL JUSTICE WORK from the House of Deputies Committee on the State of the Church

"The State of the Church committee is canonically mandated to prepare a report on the state of the Episcopal Church for the House of Deputies, which we send to the House of Bishops after we have approved it," says the Rev. Gay Clark Jennings, President of the House of Deputies. "Based on the concerns I've heard raised in my conversations with deputies and other leaders at General Convention and as I travel around the church, in 2015 I asked the group to focus on the state of the church in three specific areas: multicultural ministries, justice and advocacy ministries, and the Church Pension Fund."

The survey about social justice work, aims to gather information about the ways that dioceses and congregations are involved in advocating for a fairer and more just society. "We want to know more about how the church is advocating for economic justice, fair wages, and other justice issues," says Deputy Laura Russell of Newark, who is part of the committee's working group assessing social justice work. "Likewise, we want to know about where the church is not just feeding and assisting people in need, but also working against the structures that perpetuate racism, poverty, and hunger in our societies."

About 1990 I was invited to a Christmas Eve service at All Saints'. I met the choirmaster, Dr. Robert Poovey, who invited me to come sing in the choir. TODAY'S LOOSE PLATE OFFERING DESIGNATION



Today's loose plate offering is going to Haiti Reforestation Partnership, formerly Haiti Fund Inc. & CODEP.

All Saints' has been one of the strongest Episcopal Churches in the Partnership since the 1990s, only rivaled by Christ Church, New Bern, who was one of the founders. Several of All Saints' members have gone to Haiti to visit the CODEP forest. Parishioners, Susan Furr-Yelton and Michael McCarthy, even served on the board when it was "Haiti Fund, Inc." Now, CODEP and Haiti Reforest are starting a new chapter.

Haiti Reforestation Partnership recently changed their name to better reflect their mission and vision of reforestation. They hope to expand the CODEP method to other parts of Haiti. CODEP is transitioning from being a program of the Haiti Reforest to its own nonprofit in Haiti. CODEP currently has planted 14 million trees in 6 watersheds which is roughly the size of Asheville, NC. Right now, they have one truck to get to their 1,400 Haitian partners and it is on its last leg (or tire?). Imagine having to get around Asheville without a car and the only paved road is the Blue Ridge parkway. This is the reality for CODEP's Haitian Partners. **A working truck would change**



the lives of the 1,400 Haitian Partners and facilitate the way CODEP operates.

In order to sustainably get to all of the CODEP forest, they need at least one working truck. A Florida dealer has given Haiti Reforest a great deal on two Ford trucks for 30,000 dollars. A donor has graciously offered to pay all the shipping and taxes to get the trucks to Haiti. All CODEP has to do it pick them up in Port-Au-Prince! Almost 10,000 dollars has been raised *so far!*
