

MORE PARISH ANNOUNCEMENTS

Children & Youth Christian Formation:

The enthusiastic expressions of children's faith can help transform the church and everyone in it. Here at All Saints', we harness the enthusiasm of our children in worship as well as in Sunday school. We encourage our children to actively participate in the liturgy, and we delve into really learning and understanding the awesomeness of God in Sunday school.

- Our youngest students from age 3 through 8, participate in Catechesis of the Good Shepherd. Catechesis focuses on developing the spiritual nature of the child and his or her relationship with God while also teaching about liturgy and tradition.
- In the Re:form curriculum, students in grades 4 and 5 learn about unlikely people called by God to do amazing things. Re:form encourages tweens to see the similarities between themselves and their quirky faith ancestors. Re:form follows a three part sequence: Encounter – 15 minute video, Engage – Conversation, Respond – Regroup, Share and Send.
- Our **Middle School** Students gather on Sunday mornings for fellowship and discussion guided by the curriculum, **Making it Real and Relevant**, a lectionary based youth ministry program that uses contemporary music, movies and videos to connect faith formation with daily life. The goals are to:
 - learn that one has a life-purpose and that it is possible to discern what it is
 - to seek connection with the inner self
 - to seek connection with God and with the world
 - to experience transcendence (how one fits into the bigger picture)

"Responding to the spiritual needs of teens is about building trusting relationships. The Episcopal Church strives to walk with young people on their journeys from childhood to adulthood, recognizing their gifts for ministry, their questions about spirituality, and their desire to make a difference in the world." - National Episcopal Church

• Our **High School** Students gather on Sunday mornings for fellowship and discussion guided by the curriculum, **NOOMA:** *Exploring the world from the perspective of Jesus*.

Jesus lived with the awareness that God is doing something, right here, right now, and anybody can be a part of it. He encouraged his listeners to search, to question, to wrestle with the implications of what he was saying and doing. He inspired, challenged, provoked, comforted, and invited people to be open to God's work in this world. Wherever he went, whatever he did, Jesus started discussions about what matters most, because for Jesus, God is always inviting us to open our eyes and join in. **NOOMA** is a series of short films that are an invitation to search, question, and join the discussion.

In this renovation, one is brand new for younger children, and the choir for older children has been renamed. Both groups will learn basic musical education, learn to sing in a healthy way as well as play and accompany themselves with instruments, all carried along by the Orff Schulwerk process!



The Episcopal Church Responds to Hurricane Relief



We have watched with horror as crises were precipitated by hurricanes in the Southeast United States & Caribbean. Crisis ministry has three phases: **Rescue, Relief and Recovery**. First responders and ordinary citizens like Andrew Cobb, Jennifer Cobb's brother, have worked tirelessly to **rescue** people from the deluge unleashed by these hurricanes. This is faith at work, seeking and serving Jesus in the floodwaters.

Once people have been rescued, the ministry turns to **relief**. The Episcopal Diocese of Texas has deployed spiritual care teams to the Convention Center shelter and will continue to send new teams as other shelters open. This weekend, deacons and lay chaplains of the

diocese will be in the hardest hit neighborhoods to offer comfort and emergency funds to people who were flooded. The diocesan cathedral is helping local Episcopal churches respond to the most pressing assessed needs, whether that be space for mission teams, feeding programs and/or funding. Episcopal Relief and Development has already provided emergency funds for some of this work.

As the floodwaters recede, **recovery** begins. The diocese will begin these efforts as soon as it is safe. If you are interested in helping out, Episcopal Relief and Development has a volunteer list "Ready to Serve" which can be accessed at https://www.episcopalrelief.org/what-you-can-do/volunteer/ready-to-serve

A message from the Presiding Bishop, the Right Reverend Michael Curry:

Long ago the prophet Malachi taught that we are all children of God by virtue of our creation by the same God. "Have we not all one father? Has not one God created us," he asked (2:10). Jesus taught the same thing when he told a story about a Good Samaritan. We are indeed all the children of God. And if we are all God's children, then we are all brothers and sisters.

We have watched and witnessed the devastation in the wake of Hurricanes Harvey & Irma. Our brothers and sisters need our help.

Episcopal Relief & Development reminds us not to send food, clothing or other items because affected dioceses have limited or no capacity to receive, store or distribute goods. It is more efficient and better for the local economy to make a donation.

This month's "First Sunday Offering," \$1,200 has been sent to the Diocese of Texas to fund their work in responding to Hurricane Harvey. Going forward, I would suggest that you send financial support directly to Episcopal Relief and Development and earmark it for Hurricane Relief. with Ed Bacon and Stanley Hauerwas


In this time of divisiveness and fear, we're thrilled to offer some encouragement -with another free class .

"We live in increasingly divisive times," says Bacon, "As Christ's reconcilers in the world, we are called to act in ways that bring Christ's love for the marginalized into the public sphere." Bacon, the retired rector of All Saints' Episcopal Church in Pasadena, California, led his congregation to take political action on many issues. This contrasts with ethicist Stanley Hauerwas' who says dissent is primarily a stance Christians take in opposition to the world. "Christ calls us to be witnesses," he says, "this is how the world knows it's the world."

You can register for the course now, but it will not be available to take until Monday, September 11. It will remain open and free through Monday, September 25th.
