THE DAY OF PENTECOST

Welcome to All Saints' Episcopal Church on the Festival of Pentecost, the fiftieth day of Easter. (Pentecost means "fifty days.") Today we conclude seven weeks of celebrating our redemption, shown forth in the resurrection and ascension of Jesus and in his sending the Spirit of God to us.

This celebration of the Holy Spirit is, therefore, one of the four times in the year when Holy Baptism is particularly recommended. Today, as an essential part of the liturgy, we will renew our own Baptismal Covenant and rejoice in the baptism of new members of Christ.

In Baptism we receive the Holy Spirit, we are made new members of the company of the apostles and partakers in the resurrection life of Christ and we are sent forth in the power of the Spirit to proclaim the risen Christ to people of every race and tongue and nation. The presence of the Spirit in the Church makes God's action in the dying, rising, and glorification of Jesus of more than a note of historical interest. The continued presence of the Holy Spirit incorporates our lives into the risen life of Christ and makes us part of his Body.

In the reading from the Acts of the Apostles, we hear the account of the first Pentecost when the Apostles received the Spirit and proclaimed the Gospel in many tongues.

The second reading from Romans tells us that the entire universe is looking toward its redemption. That redemption is waiting for us and our redemption is the work of the Spirit of God dwelling in us. Paul tells the Roman church and us that the Holy Spirit is the one who is working in us when we pray. Moreover, the Spirit of God is leading us with the entire creation into redemption and resurrection.

TREE OF SEASONS



The tree of seasons is a special white tree covered in white doves that represents seasons in our spiritual life. We are now in a season of giving for reducing our church debt. As the body of Christ, once we are out from under this responsibility and burden we can offer so much more to our community. Part of our meeting this task is asking the Lord how we are to do this. God will

show us how, if we ask.

The 3-D doves are a visual representation of personal prayers, praises, needs, desires and concerns that we are giving to Jesus. We have the personal relationship with Christ to do this, and He is waiting to receive them.

This beautiful tree will be displayed in the Welcome Center through May. There are doves and supplies for your use. Enjoy some meditative art time as you create a visual representation of YOUR particular prayer or praise as we all discern God's will in our response to the Capital Campaign.
