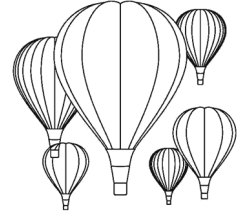

While the Stewardship Committee always has its work cut out for them, with now being no different, this year we’ll begin to see what “Set Free to Serve” looks like here at All Saints’.

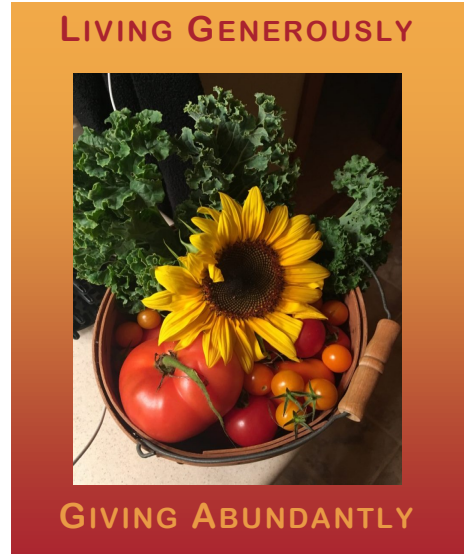
