Dr. Hayes is an Assistant Professor of History at Augusta University, Augusta, Georgia. He holds a PHD, University of Georgia; an MTS, Duke University; and a BA, Wake Forest University. Dr. Hayes studies religion in the late 19th/20th century U.S. South. He seeks to uncover lesser known religious phenomena through creative approaches--the writings of Flannery O'Connor, the music of Johnny Cash—and is especially interested in the interrelation of religion with economic change and class identity.

Safe Church Training

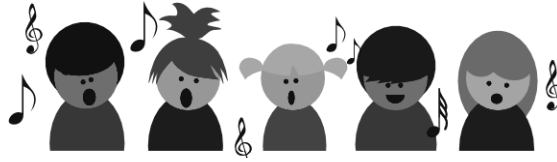
Sunday October 21st, 1-3 PM in the Community Room

Grades 4 & up: **Jr. Choir of All Saints'** Rehearsals are Tuesdays, from 6:00-7:00 PM in Room 102

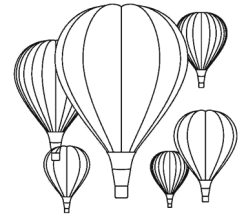

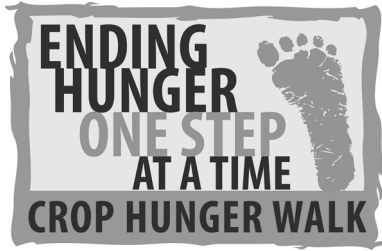
