

Presenter: Emily Badgett

The Church as a Catalyst for Social Change: A look at the Anglican Church's impact in Zanzibar, Tanzania, to close the last open legal Slave Market. Learn from our sisters and brothers across the ocean and across time as they formed a mission purely for the purpose of ending slavery through evangelism.



Emily Badgett is a Junior at the University of the South. Academically, she is double majoring in American Studies and Religious Studies, and she is also in the Certificate Program for Civic and Global Leadership. This summer, she was the Historical Research and Archive Management Intern for the East African Slave Trade Exhibit Centre at the Anglican Diocese of Zanzibar in Tanzania. Her area of study revolves around the Church as historically a proponent of social change. At Sewanee, she also works as a Sacristan at All Saints Chapel, a member of the Invite Welcome Connect Team, a

Proctor (RA), a Philanthropy Intern, and a CEEP Fellow for Voter Registration and Voter Engagement.

Reconciliation is the spiritual practice of seeking a loving, liberating and life-giving relationship with God and one another, and striving to heal and transform injustice and brokenness in ourselves, our communities, institutions and society.

Facilitators from the Bishop's Committee for Racial Justice and Reconciliation will lead this day-long seminar to be held at All Saints' Episcopal Church.

Seeing the Face of God in Each Other is one of the many efforts in realizing our diocesan commitment to Becoming a Beloved Community. It is one step toward strengthening our shared commitment to racial justice and to grow as members of a community of reconcilers and healers.

In a safe setting through interactive exercises, videos, and small group discussion, participants will explore how institutional and systemic racism impede our ability to create an inclusive community. This seminar helps to raise awareness that dismantling racism is a spiritual discipline, grounded in our Baptismal Covenant.
