As this newsletter goes to press, we are in the middle of an exciting time at All Saints'! In a short period, we have the opportunity to be free of our debt and "Set Free to Serve." With so much happening, we want to let you know the schedule of events for the remainder of the Capital Campaign.

**Sunday, April 29:** *Commitment Sunday*. We will submit our pledge cards during the 8:00 a.m., 9:00 a.m., and 11:10 a.m. services. You will receive a blank pledge card, an envelope, and a pen from the ushers. We will complete the cards during a musical interlude and then place the pledge cards in offertory plates.

**Sunday, May 6:** The Campaign Directors will announce the progress of the capital campaign at all services.

**Tuesday, May 15:** First Fruits materials will be mailed to everyone. These materials will explain the process of our 3-year commitments and an envelope for our first donations.

**Sunday, May 20:** *Pentecost Sunday/First Fruits Sunday*. We officially begin our donations for the 3-year capital campaign at all services.

Sunday, May 20: 5:00 p.m. - Our campaign closing celebration!

We hope you will be able to participate in all the above with your prayers and attendance. We look forward to the many opportunities we will have for ministry and mission as we are "Set Free to Serve"!

## **Children and Youth**

Children's Sunday School lessons this spring have focused on the ways we are called to care for and share the many gifts of God. Topics included the idea of stewardship, recognizing their individual gifts from God, and how All Saints' does great things in our community. Children in Catechesis Level 2 brainstormed ways to support the capital campaign, such as family lemonade stands or yard sales of unwanted toys. Earth Day Work Day, in collaboration with the Gardens of All Saints', gave children and their families a hands-on stewardship experience. They planted native grasses on All Saints' property to expand the North Carolina Butterfly Highway.

Our Youth will coordinate a Parents' Date Night on Saturday, April 28. They are also planning a dog wash and a car wash.

Why?

Why are we doing this Capital Campaign? The quick answer is: to pay off the debt.

The DEEPER answer is that we are Resurrection people, we believe and we have seen God bring hope out of despair, make a way where there seems to be no way and bring life out of death. For more than 137 years, the people of All Saints', later joined by the people of St. James, have offered this answer to the question WHY? "We are called to love God and love each other, to be the people of God in this place and at this time, to love as God loves."

HOW do we do that? On the night before he died for us, Jesus gave the commandment that those who follow should love one another and showed them how to love by serving. And so, we serve. This congregation serves. It is who we are, and how we are known in this community. We have continued to serve, and expand how we serve, even in the midst of our current financial challenges. In 2014, we opened a preschool that is serving the poorest of the poor. Through that preschool we are changing the future for those children.

We know that the reason *why* is not to pay bills, but to love like God loves. We can do that more fully and more freely when we are not weighted down with debt. So WHAT we need to do now is support the capital campaign with our generous, joyful pledges so that we can be set free from the weight of the debt to serve even more faithfully.

When we are *set free*, we will continue to ask: How do we love like God loves? We will watch for God's leading as we do what we believe we are called to do.

Spiritual Life Activities "Tree of Seasons "



"Tree of Seasons" is inspired by Ecclesiastes 3:1-8. It is a special white tree covered in doves, and it represents the seasons in our spiritual life. We are now in a season of giving to reduce our debt, thus freeing All Saints' for greater mission and ministry. The doves represent prayers, praises, needs and concerns that we offer to Jesus. You are encouraged to participate by reading and acting on the directions that are placed by the tree, along with doves for you to personalize.

#### **Christian Education**

Every Sunday through May 6, there will be a Bible Study during the Christian Education hour. Based on passages from Luke's Gospel, the sessions will examine stewardship. Sue Gelarden is leading the study.

#### **Daily Devotionals**

Every member is receiving a daily devotional via email (or U.S. mail if email is not active). You are invited to spend a few minutes each day reading, thinking about, and praying over the devotionals.

## Frequently Asked Questions

### What is the goal of this capital campaign?

Our goal is to reduce or eliminate our present debt, which currently stands at approximately \$1.7 million.

#### How will this "set us free to serve"?

Our mortgage payment currently consumes more than 20% of our annual spending, significantly limiting our options for new initiatives in mission and ministry. A successful campaign will allow us to direct money that currently goes to the mortgage, to our mission and ministry in our communities.

## What if I am not able to make a major gift; how would my small gift make any difference?

Every gift is important. Every dollar counts as we seek to reach the minimum match threshold. If we have pledges above the \$500,000 minimum, your dollar will count twice. Looking long term, every dollar put against the principal today saves two dollars in future mortgage payments. With the match, your gift today is immediately doubled, and future savings to All Saints' make it double again.

#### How will I know what to give?

God is gracious and generous. Begin in prayer asking, *"Gracious God, what do you want to do through me?"* God knows your situation even better than you do and can be counted on to lead you appropriately. Learn more about the difference your pledge can make, listen and ask questions. Continue in prayer, do not rush to a determination, allow God to lead your decision. You will know that you have received your answer when you have peace with your decision.

Friends and Alumni Update
