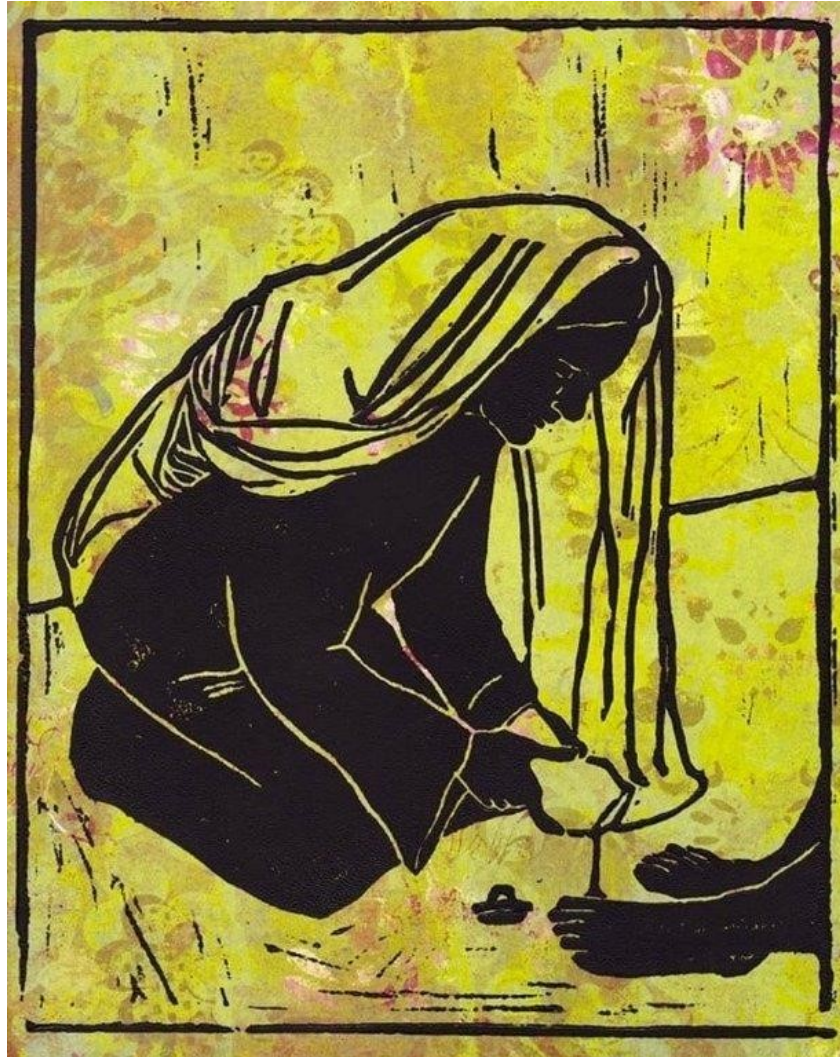

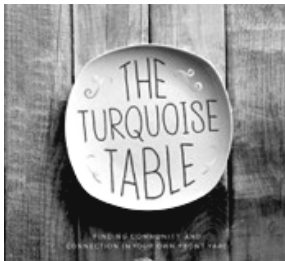

For those of you who are new to All Saints' Parish, we have a Durable Medical Equipment Exchange. Here are the items that are available to lend out:

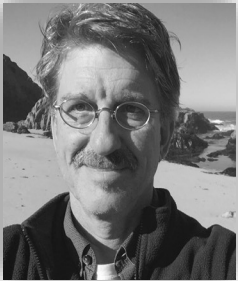
- 3 seated walkers

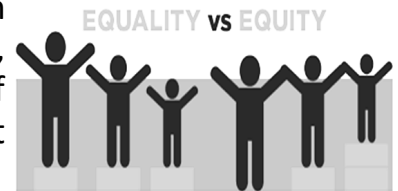
