

How can I support the CROP Hunger Walk?

- To donate, click DONATE, choose the team All Saints, then enter your donation.

What is the CROP Hunger Walk?

This is the 50th annual walk to support programs to end hunger around the world. This year, over 800 cities and towns across the U.S. will have CROP hunger walks. In Cabarrus County, 25% of the donations will go to CCM to support hunger needs in our area while 75% of the donations will be used around the world. The Church World Service provides food and water to address hunger around the world. They also provide resources, such as seeds, tools, wells and water systems, to empower communities to meet their own needs.
