

Being **Set Free to Serve** and **Set Free to Grow** calls us to two related ideas — going out and inviting in. The metaphor of getting "out of the castle" represents the intention of going into the community, being active, and becoming engaged, which is even more powerful when you are visible in the process. All Saints' has adopted the

idea of wearing red shirts whenever we participate in community ministries and events or hold our meetings "out there" in a public place. We'll use a red shirt icon to identify these opportunities.



The mirror idea is inviting people to All Saints'. Not just for worship, although that is great, but to any event or activity that lends itself to welcoming friends and neighbors. Think about Grapes for Good, After Dark @ All Saints' or the many other events that take place here. Welcome guests and symbolize that by placing a

red door icon on announcements about these events.

When you see the Red Shirt or a Red Door icon, let it be a reminder to you that here is an opportunity to connect, either by being a visible presence in the community or by welcoming folks to church.

What is All Saints' Day?

- A) A major festival of the Christian Church

The answer is — D) All the above!

- A) All Saints' Day is a major festival of the Church. Set on November 1st, it is "transferred" to the following Sunday when the 1st is not a Sunday. All Saints' Day is a time to remember our connection to the great cloud of witnesses who have gone before us, to be inspired by their lives and to recommit ourselves to the work of doing the will of God on Earth. Traditionally, it was reserved for those inspiring figures recognized across the Church. The faithfulness of all Christians who had died was celebrated on the following day, All Souls' Day, November 2nd. Today, it is more common to celebrate all those who have been baptized in the name of Christ, thereby joining the inheritance of the saints in light (Col 1:12b).
- B) All Saints' Day is an annual celebration of All Saints', Concord. Many churches are named for particular saints and celebrate their patronal (patron saint's) festival on the day appointed for that saint. For example, St. Andrew's Day is November 30th, St. Thomas Day is December 21st. At All Saints', Concord, we celebrate our festival anniversary on All Saints' Day. We remind ourselves of the stories of those who have helped shape this congregation in particular ways through their life and ministry, especially those who have died in the past year. This year, as we mark the 50th anniversary of the combined congregations, we are reminded that we stand on the shoulders of giants and lay stones for others to follow. We have so much to be thankful for and celebrate as we have been set free to serve, grow, and shine!
- C) All Saints' Sunday, November 3, 2019, concludes the fall stewardship season as parishioners are invited to place their pledge cards on the altar, symbolizing offering themselves to God and a portion of their time, talent and financial resources to God's mission through All Saints', Concord. These pledge cards, or "estimates of giving," help the leadership make spending plans for mission and ministry in 2020, giving direction to how we will live out being the people of Christ in this place and at this time.

Bring your stick for the Beating of the Bounds! | A brief pilgrimage

All Saints' Sunday, November 3, 10 AM

"Beating the bounds" is an ancient custom of the British church combining both religious and secular purposes. Old and young members of the community would walk the boundaries of the parish to reaffirm and share the knowledge of where they lay, and to pray for protection and blessings for the parish land.

When maps were rare, this allowed the parish boundaries to be handed down, a kind of community data backup. Armed with green boughs, usually birch or willow, members "beat" the parish boundary markers shouting, "Mark, Mark, Mark." Younger members were always included to ensure that witnesses to the boundaries should survive as long as possible. Clergy offered prayers, asking for God to bless the land and its harvest. While the secular purpose has been superseded by modern surveyors, "beating of the bounds" continues as a way of strengthening the community and giving it a sense of place.

"Pilgrimage is a very ancient Christian tradition, and this is a brief pilgrimage," says the Reverend Wilkes, vicar of St. Michael's, Oxford. "When we mark our parish, we mark that bit of Earth's territory that is ours. In the Anglican tradition, a congregation is given a part of the earth to pray and think about."

For All Saints' Concord, that part of the earth is at the corner of Lake Concord and Country Club Roads. See you at 10 AM on November 3rd. Please contact the office if you are mobility impaired and would like to participate. We are making arrangements for carts to transport parishioners who are not able to walk and need to have accurate numbers of places needed.


