

The High Cost of Gun Violence, Part 2

A Personal Account of the UNCC Shooting in April 2019

Today at 10 AM in the Parish Hall | Jeff Baker, UNCC Chief of Campus Police

Jeff Baker, UNCC Chief of Campus Police, was on the scene of the campus shooting in 2019 and played a leadership role in the university's response to this tragic incident. Chief Baker joined the UNC Charlotte team in 2009 after spending 28 years as a member of the Charlotte-Mecklenburg Police Department. He earned his BS Degree from Gardner-Webb University as well as an Associate's Degree from Central Piedmont Community College. Chief Baker was awarded the Charlotte Police Medal of Merit for bravery in the line of duty, and he was named Campus Safety Director of the Year in 2013 by Campus Safety and Security Magazine.
