

World Health Organization has a few basic tips to avoid illness

In depth detail can be found at https://tinyurl.com/vr9owsn. Pertaining to worship, those who are unwell should avoid handshaking during the Peace (consider elbow bumps or a friendly wave). Avoid intinction (dipping bread to wine), as it does little to avoid spread of illness. There is little evidence of risk of disease associated with a common cup, but each parishioner must use their own discretion. Utilize the hand sanitizer stations by entry doors before and after worship.
