A Reading from the book of Exodus.

When Aaron and all the Israelites saw Moses, the skin of his face was shining, and they were afraid to come near him. Jesus took with him Peter and John and James, and went up on the mountain to pray. And while he was praying, the appearance of his face changed, and his clothes became dazzling white. Suddenly they saw two men, Moses and Elijah, talking to him. They appeared in glory and were speaking of his departure, which he was about to accomplish at Jerusalem. Now Peter and his companions were weighed down with sleep; but since they had stayed awake, they saw his glory and the two men who stood with him. A Blessing of the Backpacks and the School Year

Children, youth, and all those bearing backpacks in the congregation are invited to come forward, bringing their backpacks to be blessed.

Leader: Today, we have before us backpacks to be carried to and from school. These backpacks will be stuffed into lockers, shoved under desks, and hung on hooks. As the year progresses some will get wet, some muddy, some scuffed, and some might look as pristine as they day

there were purchased. They are the steady travel companions of those students upon whose shoulders they hang.

These backpacks will contain work to be done, work that's been returned, books to be enjoyed and to be studied, and tools for learning. All sorts of things will find their way in and out of these backpacks, some papers will be crumpled to the bottom or float out the top. Erasers, pencils, coins, and crayons might shuffle along the bottoms of these bags, all reminders of a year full of experiences, challenges, and triumphs. Some days, so much stuff will fill these backpacks that you may find it a difficult burden to carry. Other days, they will be nearly empty and easy in their weight. However, on each and every day, these backpacks represent the responsibility and the work required of you. And so, bring them before God for blessing.

Let us pray together:

All: Gracious God, we lift to you today these students and the bags that they carry.

We ask your blessing on each of them as they commit themselves to study and learning in the school year ahead.

We ask your blessing on their backpacks. These backpacks will be the companion of our students each day as they live into the learning their schools and teachers provide. As these students carry these backpacks, may they be reminded of the constant companion they have in Christ, and the of love and support of this congregation that surrounds them each and every school day.

We ask your blessing on the teachers, administrators, and staff in our schools. May they be reminded that this congregation embraces their call to teaching and supporting students within their charge and may the staff be reminded of the love and support that surrounds them as well. We pray for the safety of all those within the school buildings, that the protective and loving presence of Christ enshrine them in comfort and security.

We pray all this in the name of Jesus, who we seek to follow day by day and the power of the Holy Spirit who inspires us. Amen.

THE HOLY COMMUNION

A note about receiving Holy Communion: In the Episcopal Church, we understand that Christ is "really present" in the bread and wine provided from God's table. All who claim Christ as Lord are always welcome to receive the sacrament of Holy Communion in this church. Children are welcome to receive communion at the discretion of their parents.

Come forward at the direction of the ushers. Receive the consecrated wafer in the palm of your outstretched hand from the first person who comes to you. To receive a gluten-free wafer, please cross your hands palms down. Wine may be received by lightly dipping the bread into the small cup in the center of the plate/paten from which you received the bread. Alternatively, you may choose to drink from the larger cup/chalice which the next person will offer you. Receive the consecrated wine by guiding the offered cup to your lips and sipping. Those who distribute the wine will wipe the chalice with a food safe sanitizer and turn it for the next person after each person receives. You may also decide to take the wafer only. If you choose not to receive communion, you may cross your arms over your chest and receive a blessing as your presence is a blessing to all of us. Once you have been blessed or received communion, you may offer a short prayer and then return to your seat.

If physical limitations make it difficult to come forward, please let an usher know that we may have the honor of bringing communion to you.
