The First Reading: Acts 1-2 (adapted for children)

A reading from the book of the Acts of the Apostles.

For more than a month after He had risen, Jesus appeared to his friends at many different times. During those weeks, Jesus helped His disciples understand many things that they had not been able to understand before He died. One day, Jesus spoke to his disciples on the slopes of the Mount of Olives. Jesus told them they would not see Him any longer. He reminded them they had work to do, they had to tell the whole world about Jesus. But before they went to work, Jesus told them to go back to Jerusalem and wait for God to send the Holy Spirit to help them. While He was speaking, Jesus was lifted up, and a cloud took Him out of their sight.

The disciples went back to Jerusalem. While they waited, they talked and prayed. They knew that Jesus would no longer appear suddenly to talk to them, but once His Spirit came, Jesus would be with them in a new way.

Seven weeks after Passover, the Jewish people celebrated the festival of Pentecost in thanksgiving for the first harvest. Soon Jerusalem was packed with pilgrims once again, as Jewish people from all over the world returned for the happy celebration. Early

that Sunday morning, on the day of Pentecost, Jesus' disciples were all together, when something strange happened. Suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Separate tongues, like little flames, appeared and one rested on each of them. But what they could see and hear was nothing compared to how they felt inside. The warmth and life that Jesus always brought with him were there again, and they knew that the promised Holy Spirit had come. The disciples were so happy that they rejoiced aloud and praised God.

Meanwhile, a huge crowd had collected outside the house. They had seen and heard some of the strange happenings and were curious to know what was going on. When the disciples came out of the house and onto the street, the people in the crowd were even more amazed. Each person heard the disciples in their own native language. Everyone there, no matter what country they had come from, understood perfectly what the disciples were saying, as they gave thanks for God's wonderful gift.

And when he comes, he will prove the world wrong about sin and righteousness and judgment: about sin, because they do not believe in me; about righteousness, because I am going to the Father and you will see me no longer; about judgment, because the ruler of this world has been condemned. "I still have many things to say to you, but you cannot bear them now. When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all the truth; for he will not speak on his own, but will speak whatever he hears, and he will declare to you the things that are to come. He will glorify me, because he will take what is mine and declare it to you. All that the Father has is mine. For this reason I said that he will take what is mine and declare it to you."

Small Group Discussion

On Pentecost (a Jewish festival of the fiftieth day after Passover), Jesus' disciples were gathered for prayer at 9 o'clock in the morning. Suddenly, the room was filled with a rush of wind and tongues of fire, and they spoke in languages that all around could understand. In explaining what was happening, Peter quoted the prophet Joel: "I will pour out my Spirit upon all flesh, and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams."

In the Gospel from John, Jesus teaches his disciples about the Holy Spirit, promising an advocate and guide. An advocate who will testify on behalf of Jesus to the world and a guide who will lead Jesus' disciples into truths they are not yet ready to bear.

Select one set of the following questions to answer in a small group of three to four people. Listen without discussion as each person shares their answer to the questions.

- What might Pentecost look like today? Do we dare to see visions and dream dreams? Of what might those visions and dreams consist?
- What do you make of the different portrayals of the Holy Spirit in today's readings (fire of passion, advocate, guide,

intercessor, spirit of truth)? What have you learned from God recently that you could not hear before?

• What might be the sorts of truths that we ourselves are not yet ready to hear? And how might we listen for the voice of the Holy Spirit guiding us in the direction of those truths?

THE HOLY COMMUNION

A note about receiving Holy Communion: In the Episcopal Church, we understand that Christ is "really present" in the bread and wine provided from God's table. All who claim Christ as Lord are always welcome to receive the sacrament of Holy Communion in this church. Children are welcome to receive communion at the discretion of their parents.

Come forward at the direction of the ushers. Receive the consecrated wafer in the palm of your outstretched hand from the first person who comes to you. To receive a gluten-free wafer, please cross your hands palms down. Wine may be received by lightly dipping the bread into the small cup in the center of the plate/paten from which you received the bread. Alternatively, you may choose to drink from the larger cup/chalice which the next person will offer you. Receive the consecrated wine by guiding the offered cup to your lips and sipping. Those who distribute the wine will wipe the chalice with a food safe sanitizer and turn it for the next person after each person receives. You may also decide to take the wafer only. If you choose not to receive communion, you may cross your arms over your chest and receive a blessing as your presence is a blessing to all of us. Once you have been blessed or received communion, you may offer a short prayer and then return to your seat.

If physical limitations make it difficult to come forward, please let an usher know that we may have the honor of bringing communion to you.
